## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Today's feast originated in the Church of the East, hence the Greek word "Epiphany" which means a divine manifestation or a revelation. It is a feast of universal scope reminding us that Jesus came as a savior for all people, for people of every land and nation.

The story of the Magi is found only in Matthew's Gospel and has become a treasured part of the celebration of Christmas. What child does not want to be selected as one of the "Kings" for the Christmas pageant.

Matthew calls these exotic visitors from the East "Magi". The word "Magi" originally referred to a caste of Persian priests who served their King. They were not Kings or Wise Men but they were adept at interpreting dreams. In the Gospel account of Matthew they appear to be astrologers who can interpret the movement of the stars. Sometimes Magi were associated with sorcery and magic and not always held in high regard. Matthew portrays the Magi very favorably.

These visitors from the East who respond positively to Jesus stand in stark contrast to Herod. They also stand in contrast to the chief priests and the scribes who have the Scriptures. They can quote their Scriptures readily but they never made the journey over to Bethlehem.

The first human word in Matthew's Gospel is the one the Magi address to Herod: Where...? Where is the new born King of the Jews. It is also the question of Herod when he summons the chief priests and scribes. "Where is the Christ to be born", he asked. The first question was a sincere search for the truth; the second one was insincere and born of fear and panic.

The story of the Magi of Matthews Gospel has been embellished through the centuries. The "Magi from the East" in Matthew's account have been elevated to royalty as three Kings with specific names in the Christian imagination. The story has found its way into song, stained glass windows, Christmas pageants, and literature.

It is of course our story. We are hidden in the middle of it. We are, all of us, seekers and travelers on a restless journey for meaning and truth. This story has universal and timeless appeal. We journey through life in search of more, in search of the God who gives meaning to our journey. Today's feast assures us that our search is not in vain. This story is one with a happy ending and it gives us hope and courage for our journey.

For the Magi the journey was marked by hardship and doubt as T.S. Eliot has so wonderfully reminded us. The signs offered were often ambiguous—appearing and disappearing, and violence threatened to cut short the quest. And yet, and yet! May we be faithful to our own journey that we may find the truth beyond all truth.




