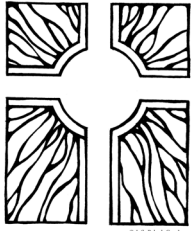

Good News to Share!

After many years of waiting and praying and negotiating with the owners, we have finally purchased 6.9 acres of land next to our Church property (northwest side) for future Church expansion. Thanks to the Building Committee, the Finance Council, and the Pastoral Council for their guidance and support of this project. Thanks too to Rodney Martin who patiently stayed in touch with the owners (who lived in California) to secure their goodwill.

The following questions and answers will keep you informed.

1. What was the cost of the new property?

-The price was \$175,000.00, including all fees and legal work.

2. Where did the money come from?

-We were able to use money from the Church Building Fund to purchase the land. Thanks for your faithful monthly support of the Building Fund which we will now need to replenish.

3. What will the land be used for?

-Future Church expansion such as Parish Hall, Youth Center, extra parking, outdoor space for recreation, etc. Of course these things will not happen tomorrow but we can begin to plan now.

4. What is the immediate task for the property?

-We need to clean out the undergrowth, bushes, and level out the land and plant it with grass so that it is user friendly.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Lenten season has begun here at Our Lady of the Lake Parish with many hopeful signs. The Masses on Ash Wednesday were very well attended. Of special interest was the large number of Hispanic Catholics at the evening Mass. Thanks to Fr. Alex Steinmiller for coming from Birmingham to celebrate the Sacrament of Confession in Spanish.

There was also a noticeable increase in the number of Parishioners attending the Stations of the Cross on Friday evening. This traditional Lenten devotion is still a moving experience when bathed in faith. Attendance at the weekend Masses for the First Sunday of Lent also showed an increase and the Daily Mass attendance shows a healthy increase. Of course one week does not a Lenten season make. I hope we all continue with our Lenten Resolutions to make this season a time of conversion and spiritual growth and transformation.

The Reading from Genesis (12:1-4) opens with God telling Abram, an old man of 75, to journey to some land, that, at some point, God will show him. This is a vague instruction. Not even a map for a guide. Promises of great blessings abound, but these will come after Abram's death. Could we blame Abram for being skeptical at first? What would we have done. Spiritual journeys are a lifelong process. To be faithful to the journey, the quest, is the challenge.

The Gospel selection for today's Liturgy (Matthew 17:1-9) is Matthew's timeless account of the Transfiguration. We read this Gospel story always on the Second Sunday of Lent. Young people might call the account "awesome". Jesus is Transfigured (utterly changed) with Moses (the law) and Elijah (the prophet) at his side.

Rather than entering the moment, Peter attempts to hold on to it by erecting three tents. An old adage has it: "when in doubt, build". Today we would probably whip out a camera or smart phone to "capture" the moment. How often we miss the Holy in our midst. How strange that the word "listen" appears at the end of the account. "Speak Lord, for your Servant is listening". Indeed—indeed.

Parish Mission: a time for awe and listening. A pause in the journey for refreshment. Fr. Leonard of the Missionary Servants of the Eternal Word will lead us in prayer and reflection. We welcome Fr. Leonard and we hope you will make the Mission special for all of us by your attendance each evening.

A Grief Observed: We mourn the untimely passing from our Diocesan Presbyterate, of Fr. David Buchanan, (58) Priest and Ph. D. His gifted mind was accompanied by a restless heart. Quiet and unassuming, his journey was often stormy. May he rest in the peace of the just.

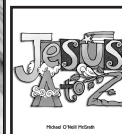
