

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The youth who would be king not by his own choice or the vote of the people but by a divine choice—David, the Shepherd-King in today's scripture. (1 Samuel 16:6-13)..

A blind man sitting by the roadside one day when Jesus happened to be passing by was the recipient of physical sight which he never asked for or expected. But, more than physical sight, he also received the light of faith. His joyful response: "I do believe, Lord" followed by his act of worship offered to Jesus is the culmination of a dramatic story in the Gospel reading this Sunday.

The Shepherd boy David was out in the fields tending his father's sheep when the prophet Samuel came looking for him: He almost missed the prophet's visit. His seven brothers were presented to Samuel in the hope that one of them would be the one God wanted to be King. Here the rules of logic and the ancient custom of seeing the first-born son as favored had to give way to God's choice. Even though David was the youngest, he was the one chosen. God's ways are often surprising and mysterious as always, God remains supremely free in his decisions and in the Gospel story everyone is blind in some way. The disciples were locked in to an old theology that said physical handicap is a punishment for sin. Jesus said no to that.

The Pharisees, the keepers and guardians of the faith, had no idea how to explain what Jesus did. The Sabbath, they said was no time for miracles.

The neighbors did not recognize the blind man after he received his sight. Why could they not see this? The parents of the blind man considered membership in the Synagogue more important than standing up for their son and accepting his cure.

The man who had been born blind came to full sight and the insight of faith. All the other characters in this all too human story fall into pervasive blindness.

Where are the blind spots in my life? What prejudice or unexamined custom or bad theology has kept me from seeing the light and the truth?

Pope Francis on what the Church needs in its Leaders:
"Leaders who can appeal to the world to charm it with the beauty of love and to seduce it with the freedom bestowed by the Gospel....sowers of the Word, confident of its truth" (Feb. 27, 2014).

And a Prayer too: "May every little death in life teach us how to die the last death that is the beginning of true life" (Caryll Houselander—1954).


