

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Today we celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. Normally this Sunday would be designated the Thirteenth Sunday of the year but because it falls on June 29th, the Solemn Feast of Saints Peter and Paul takes precedence.

Two more different apostles would be hard to find. Peter was a member of the Twelve and spokesman for the apostles. Paul was not a member of Jesus' inner circle and, only after experiencing a vision of the Risen Lord Jesus, had a dramatic conversion (Acts 9). He had strongly persecuted the Church and counted himself as "least of the Apostles". (I Cor. 15:9)

Peter symbolizes the Papacy (the Gospel Reading today reflects this) and is identified with church hierarchical structure (the keys). Paul favored a more charismatic organization in his Churches.

Peter left little written legacy. 1-2 Peter are later letters written in his name. Paul is the greatest letter writer of the New Testament. Peter was bold in professing his faith but ashamed that his bravado failed him at Jesus' arrest. Paul emphasized humility, and power in weakness.

Even though they were different in life, in death they were united in bearing witness for the faith. Ancient Christian tradition holds that both died a martyr's death in Rome about the same time (63-64 A.D.). Both are remembered as ardent missionaries, bold preachers of the Gospel message and faithful witnesses to Jesus Christ whom they loved.

Throughout Christian history Peter and Paul have been portrayed together. Icons, paintings, and ancient graffiti present them together. The Acts of the Apostles is essentially their book. Peter dominates the first half, while Paul is clearly the hero of the second half.

The Church has celebrated this solemn feast since ancient times. It may commemorate either the remembered date of their martyrdom or the transfer of their relics to Rome. Peter is en-tombed at St. Peter's Basilica, Paul in St. Paul's outside the wall.

On this day in Rome, newly appointed Archbishops receive the Pallium, the woolen vestment worn around the neck. A delegation from the Ecumenical Patriarch in Constantinople visits Rome to celebrate the Feast. (From an article by Fr. Ronald Witherup, biblical scholar).

July Fourth: This week on Friday we observe the birthday of the nation, mindful especially of the blessing of religious freedom. We will have Mass at 9am and invite you to join us in Thanksgiving. This is also the First Friday. We will have Eucharistic Adoration until 11am.

A Grief Observed: We are saddened at the death of Andrew Centilli after a long struggle with illness. He was a quiet man of deep faith whose kindness helped so many. Our sympathy and prayers are with his sons and with his mother, Mary Esther Krantz. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.



