PASTOR'S MESSAGE

I hope your celebration of the Fourth of July was a source of inspiration and gratitude for you. We take the blessings of freedom and peace so easily for granted. The words of the Declaration of Independence are still stunning and inspired after 238 years. There are moments in history when individuals are truly inspired and soar with brilliance and poetic fervor. The human spirit at such moments seems to transcend normal boundaries and calls out our better angels.

The Gospel for this Sunday (the Fourteenth Sunday in the year) has its own power and reveals the very wisdom of God. It was a time in the ministry of Jesus when things were not going well for Him. The crowds were turning away from Him; some were hostile to His message.

The surprising thing is that Jesus used that occasion to turn to His Father in prayer. The prayer is not one of complaint, but one of praise. In that hour of darkness He gave praise and thanks to the Father. He marveled that God often gives a special wisdom to “the little ones” more than the proud elites.

Undoubtedly Jesus was thinking of children but also those who in child-like trust are open to God. The “little ones” are vulnerable and reliant on others for so much. They learn well to trust and to depend on parents and others. Thus children and the child-like are good models for drawing close to God.

We must come to God in simple trust. Knowing our limits and our weaknesses we can make room for God. We all are to become like “little ones” as we approach God with trust and simplicity. Arrogance and pride will be obstacles and will keep us from God.

Jesus invites us at the close of this Sunday Gospel “to come to him when we labor and are burdened and He will give us rest”. We are to learn from Him and then find relief from the burdens of life. St. Augustine said he had read the great words of Greek Philosophers and never found words like these. They provide comfort still for countless people who bear heavy burdens in a world of so much suffering.

Fr. Michael Casey, a Cistercian Monk from Australia, writes, “The more attached we become to the person of Jesus, the easier and more pleasant life becomes. The more time we spend with Christ, the more Christ-like we become”.

A Plea for Peace: “It is my hope that this meeting will mark the beginning of a new journey, where we seek the things that unite, so as to overcome the things that divide.” (Pope Francis at the historic Prayer for Peace in the Holy Land, held at the Vatican on June 8, 2014)




The Legion of Mary

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 6

Theme: Jesus refreshes and strengthens us for ministry.

Question for Youth: Jesus invites us to bring him our burdens, and promises us that he will give us rest. How do you rely on Jesus during times of trouble? When has Jesus helped you?

SUMMER CHALLENGE taken from the "Joy of the Gospel Study Guide"

by Bill Huebsch: **Invitation to all** to pause at this moment in their lives and allow their hearts to be touched by Christ.

Be renewed! Do this daily. This is for EVERYONE.

If you take risk of giving yourself, heart and soul, to Christ, he will respond each and every time. His arms are open. Don't ever stop returning to Christ with your whole heart.

REFLECTION : Challenges facing Today's World: As a human family, we're making great advances in people's welfare, but at the same time many people are living in terrible situations. We have learned a lot in modern times, but we have not yet learned how to share wealth with everyone. We still have economic inequality. We pay close attention to every move in the stock market, but when our brothers & sisters lie dying in the streets, it's not really news any longer. Our lives are driven by the market and if people don't fit in they are thrown away, their labor exhausted and then left to die. God, however, calls us to live with ethics. As St John Chrysostom said, "not to share one's wealth with the poor is to steal from them and take away their livelihood. It is not our own goods that we hold, but theirs."

QUESTION: What is your experience of meeting the poor, either in person or by reading about their lives in the news? What are you doing to help the poor? How does our Catholic social teaching reflect the Gospel and the teachings of Jesus? Let's reflect not only the poor, but other unjust social structures undermining Christ's peace. Ex: Violence towards one another; injustice; religious intolerance; local cultures of traditions and values; issues of life and marriage; family structure; individualism; pride; addictions; pornography; or simply low Mass attendance. Are you standing up to the culture and living the richness of the Faith? Are you the spark that ignites the flame?

How will YOU pass on the Faith to family, friends and the stranger on street?
