PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

In the revised Liturgical Calendar, following the Second Vatican Council this feast day is placed on the last Sunday of the Church year. It sums up and brings together all that the Church has celebrated in the year now coming to a close. Here is the reminder that Jesus Christ is the center and source of all our liturgical celebrations. It is he who gathers up all our prayers and presents them to the Father.

Today we proclaim a central truth, a fundamental belief: Christ stands at the center of history. He is the bearer of our hopes. He is the hinge on which history turns. He is the ultimate measure of what it means to be human. He is the final yardstick of what is good. He is the shepherd-king in the tradition of David.

The first reading from Ezekiel (34: 11-12, 15-17) presents a familiar Biblical image of shepherd and sheep. There is an indictment against the political leaders of Israel. They had shepherded themselves and not the sheep. (Where have we heard that before?). The Lord promises to remove these shepherds. He himself will shepherd them, nurturing, rescuing and healing them.

The passage speaks of a personal, unmediated relationship between God and the people. It is wonderful to reflect on how God takes care of us. We feel protected and safe as the Lord nourishes us. However, this does not give us license to mistreat others. The end of today's reading reminds us that we are evaluated on how we treat each other, especially the weakest among us. The care we receive must be shared with the rest of the community. It is never about me and God, but God, me, and others.

There is a strange and powerful irony in Matthew's Last Judgement (25: 31-46). We can not perform these corporal works of mercy to "earn points" with God. If that is our intent, then we already have our reward (Matthew 6: 1-18). It is when we are not trying to impress God but are responding to human need that we do, in fact, serve God. In this, Matthew is consistent and adamant. Responding to human need has priority over religious acts; attending to and investing ourselves in this life will guide us to eternal life. The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!
