

#### **Pastor's Message**

A special welcome today to Fr. John Paul of the Franciscan Missionaries of the Eternal Word who is preaching at all the weekend Masses and leading our Parish Mission on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday this week.

Fr. John Paul's religious community is located in Birmingham. The special charism of this community is to evangelize the world through the use of media, especially radio and T.V. You will have seen Fr. John Paul frequently on E.W.T.N. as he celebrates the daily Mass which is televised around the world. He frequently appears on panel shows and in interviews on E.W.T.N.

He is a dedicated and zealous young priest committed to proclaiming the Gospel in word and deed, giving witness to the Holy in our midst and inviting us to live the Gospel with joy and enthusiasm. We are very honored and blessed that he has graciously agreed to lead our Lenten Parish Mission.

The first Scripture reading read on this Sunday is from the book of Exodus (20:1-17). God delivers the Commandments to the Israelites. These are the requirements for membership in the Covenant and faithfulness to them is expected. The Covenant arose from God's initiative who chose a people to be his special inheritance. These commandments (sometimes called the Decalogue) are valid for all time. They are the safeguards that make life in a community possible and that can lead to human flourishing.

St. Paul reminds us in the second reading (I Corinthians 1:22-25) that we too are a covenant people. We are drawn into that unconditional relationship with God through Jesus Christ crucified. When we come to share in the Eucharist on Sunday we commit to that relationship as an expression of thanks for a love we cannot equal.

The Gospel Reading (John 2:13-25) assigned for this Sunday is one of the first public acts of Jesus in John's Gospel. It takes place at the beginning of Jesus' ministry, during one of his three trips to Jerusalem. He drives out the sellers of oxen, sheep and doves, along with the money-changers. In a moment of righteous anger he uses a whip of cords and overturns tables and coins in the process. He makes the dramatic and prophetic announcement: "Destroy this Temple and in three days I will raise it up". A preview of his death and resurrection.

What is there in my life at this time that needs cleansing?

Something To Ponder: Kayla Mueller, age 23 from Arizona volunteered to go to Syria to help refugee children. She was kidnapped and killed by members of ISIS. On her twenty third birthday she wrote a letter to her father that included these words: "I find God in the suffering eyes reflected in mine. If this is how you are revealed to me, this is how I will forever seek you. I will always seek God. Some people find God in nature. Some people find God in love; I find God in suffering. I've known for some time what my life's work is, using my hands to relieve suffering." Such courage and such rare insight. We pray for all who take risks every day to relieve the suffering of the world.




