Pastor's Message

Our Parish celebrated the Sacrament of Marriage with two of our young parishioners, Shon Stice and Megan Frey on Friday evening. In their great faith and commitment they pledged their lives to God and each other in the beautiful wedding vows. Here was a miracle of Grace happening before our eyes. It was a grace-filled and moving occasion in the presence of family members, friends, clergy and parishioners. Somehow we had the sense that this is the way things are supposed to be.

Congratulations to Shon and Megan and their fine families for giving us this wonderful witness in a time when marriage is often dismissed as old fashioned. We pray that God will bless Shon and Megan with abundant blessings. Their faith and goodness have enriched all of us.

By a happy coincidence today's first reading and the Gospel reading from Mark (10:2-16) speak about covenantal marriage too.

In the Genesis account (2:18-324) we have a sublime, poetic passage (not a literal history) of the creation of human beings and the institution of marriage as a union of one man and one woman.

According to the Biblical account the woman was to be a "suitable partner" for the man. Not a helper or a servant but an equal. The union of a man and woman is presented as the fitting and fulfilling relationship of the two.

This sublime and elegant passage is so balanced. What started out as a cry against being alone concludes with "two becoming one". The oneness at the end is relationship.

In the Gospel passage from Mark, Jesus explores the question of how the relationship of marriage as lived out for those who take discipleship seriously. Questioned about the practice of divorce in the Jewish culture in which he lived, Jesus uses the occasion to reflect on the divine plan and purpose of marriage as enunciated "at the beginning in Genesis". He teaches that unconditional, life-long fidelity is what is really intended in a marriage. A fidelity that reflects God's fidelity.

Here we have the ideal. A challenge most surely and one that will involve sacrifice. While we always uphold and teach the ideal, we also know that sin and failure often leaves couples hurt and hurting. The dream can turn into a nightmare. Here the Church, as a kind mother, must offer compassion and pastoral care to help heal people and offer hope and a way to begin again.


