### Today's Readings



**First Reading** — The widow of Zarephath had only a handful of flour and a little oil, but made a little cake for Elijah. (1 Kings 17:10-16)

## Pastor's Message

"There is only a handful of flour in my jar" (1 Kings 17:12). If we are to understand the widow of Zarephath, in the first reading today from the Book of Kings, we need to notice something about her that has probably not been part of our own experience: she is starving.

She and her son have come to the end of the road. They were probably rationing what little food they had left as the days became more ominous. The food was fast running out and no prospects for a fresh supply.

Meals must have become fewer and smaller. She and her son must have been wasting away long before they got to the last handful of flour.

Yet, when a stranger asked her for something to eat, she, to our great amazement did not say no. She offered the customary and expected hospitality to the prophet Elijah.

Elijah's greeting, "Do not be afraid," is reminiscent of the assurance a messenger of God gives when God's intervention is at hand. Remember the greetings of the angel to Mary and then to Joseph in the narrative of the Nativity.

Although the human elements of this story are touching, they point to a larger truth. The providence of God works in favor of those who are vulnerable and in need of strength for the journey of life.

The widow in this reading could very well be a model for us when we think we are down to our last bit of strength or feel our hope ebbing away. We all need to hear those marvelous words coming from Elijah: "The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry". God renews us each morning with a fresh supply of hope. The cups of our lives are replenished, against all odds.

We meet another widow in the Gospel (Mark 12:38-44). She too is generous to a fault. Jesus noticed her great faith. It is said she was a "poor widow". She must have been almost destitute. Her two small coins flung into the Temple treasury constituted "all she had". By way of contrast, the other donors gave from their surplus. They didn't even miss what they gave.

This story has given us a phrase in the English language. It is the "Widow's Mite". Something small but something that represents real sacrifice. Let us never underestimate our gifts or think what we give is too small. God notices even the smallest gift and rewards us beyond our imagining.

Reflecting  
On Today's Readings

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Blessings come in many shapes and sizes, wouldn't you agree? The beatitudes, (last week's Gospel), are the blessings that really proclaim the way of Jesus. The readings today took me back to last week's Gospel:

*Blessed are the poor in spirit,  
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*

MT 5:3

This, if you think about it, is the foundation for all of the beatitudes and for the whole value system of Jesus.

When Jesus is talking about "Blessed are the poor," he's talking more about an attitude, a way of knowing one's need for God, a disposition of the heart and not simply an economic state.



This "attitude" is an awareness that allows us to be more dependent on HIM. Poor in spirit means that we understand a profound truth about ourselves --

the truth that none of us is responsible for our own existence as well as our continuing existence.

This is a true call to conversion. A call to break away from the attitudes of the world.

There's so much that will change in our thinking and in our way of acting once we have that deep sense of knowing we need God and our very being depends upon God's constant, infinite, unlimited, unconditional love for each one of us.

*Lord, send out Your Spirit  
and renew the face of the earth.*

O Holy Spirit, descend  
plentifully into my heart.  
Enlighten the dark corners  
of this neglected dwelling  
and scatter there Thy  
cheerful beams.
