Pastor's Message

As the Church nears the end of the Liturgical year, the Scripture texts take on a more ominous tone. Each of the readings speaks of a future time when there will be judgment and a reckoning before God.

Biblical scholars refer to such passages as apocalyptic literature. The tone of the text is foreboding and the imagery includes cosmic upheaval. Such language is metaphorical and not to be taken literally.

The outcome will see good triumph over evil and new life will overcome the sting of death. The reign of God will be victorious. In the meantime there is great hope.

The first reading (Daniel 12:1-3) describes a vision of the prophet Daniel. The book of Daniel was written around 160 B.C. in a time of intense persecution. It offers hope for faithful Jews and gives evidence of a beginning belief in life after death.

Here is a vision of hope in a difficult time. Those who remained faithful to God would "Be like the stars forever". The description of the end times that we see in today's passage from Mark's Gospel (13:24-32) is typical of apocalyptic literature. At work here is the belief that in the original creation of the world, chaos gave way to order. The world was seen as a place of fixed times and seasons. Jesus speaks of a new heaven and a new earth that will result from the turmoil of earth and heavens in the final days.

The curious advice in the middle of today's Gospel reading: "Learn a lesson from the fig tree". What could this possibly mean? The fig tree was one of the most valuable trees of the ancient Near East. A symbol of peace and abundance. It was regarded by the Egyptians as the Tree of Life. It was an important source of food.

Unlike most of the trees of Palestine which are evergreens, the fig tree lost its leaves and became dormant in winter. With the advent of spring it would revive and once again become a wondrous spreading tree, providing both fruit and shade.

Jesus cautions his followers: keep your eye on the fig tree. Look out for the signs of God's presence. See his care and providence at work in an uncertain world. Do not be led into fear or fright. Hear the music of God's presence even when God seems to be silent.

**Reflecting  
On Today's Readings**

In last week's reflection we discussed an attitude of the heart; a deep sense of knowing we need God and our very being depends upon God's constant, infinite, unlimited, unconditional love for each of us.

In this week's reading, God in His Mercy is calling each of us to be ready for when our call comes. If we are being called to BE READY, shouldn't we prepare?


