Pastor's Message

Another liturgical year opens before us as we enter the season of Advent.

Advent asks us to look forward (to the end times), back (to the Bethlehem journey), and within (to our hearts) to discover in all three one thing; God is with us. Emmanuel. The Roman Missal gives a nice understanding of Advent when it says: "Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas, in which the first coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's second coming at the end of time. For these reasons, Advent is a time of devout and expectant delight".

In earlier Church history Advent had a more penitential character. It was a time of fasting with emphasis on the Sacrament of Confession. Some of this aspect of the Advent season remains today. The purple vestments (as in Lent), the absence of the Gloria from the Advent Masses, and increased availability of the Sacrament of Confession.

For many the Advent wreath has become a symbol of Advent. The wreath with its purple candles and evergreens touches people by its simplicity. Families or individuals will come forward at each weekend Mass to light a candle on the Advent wreath. A simple gesture with a world of meaning. In this season we light candles of hope to brighten a darkened world. In a dangerous world, peppered with threats of violence and terrorism, we can all do with candles of hope and the assurance that God, Emmanuel, is with us.

The Gospel selection from Luke (Ch. 21:25-28, 34-36) uses apocalyptic images. They are Biblical codes that refer to the end time and final judgement. The cosmic upheaval, a sort of reversal of creation, indicates a theophany, a divine intervention of God in human time and affairs. But this is not intended to strike fear into people but rather a sense of heightened anticipation.

The event that is foretold will not be one of destruction but of redemption and transformation. Still, there is the risk that we become complacent or "burdened by the anxieties of daily life". We are to pray that we be sober and vigilant. The directive to pray is a special Lukan concern. Jesus in Luke's Gospel is known to be steeped in prayer. Can I find more time to pray this Advent?

Mercy Upon Mercy: Pope Francis has designated this new liturgical year as an extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy. A Holy Year centered on the experience of God's mercy. We hope to offer a number of special events and reflections on the theme of God's mercy. More on this later.

Pope Francis Says: "Mercy is not something God does, but who he is. The Church is commissioned to announce the mercy of God, the beating heart of the Gospel". (M.V. 12)

FIRST SUNDAY OF *Advent*

"Advent," a season of preparation and hope. We are summoned in the first week of Advent to be on guard, to be ready and prepared for the coming of the Lord.

Unfortunately, this holy season gets lost in the shuffle of preparations for Christmas, already begun in our secular society. A maze of glitter and frivolity highlights the material aspects of a feast that is long off, and misses the true spiritual meaning of that event.

So we need the Advent season to help us focus our attention on a spiritual preparation for the celebration of this greatest event of history, the birth of Christ. All too quickly Christmas Day will be here. It will have much more meaning for us if we have prepared for that day spiritually.

I invite you to take out a moment each day to reflect with me on our reasons for hope this Advent season. Our spiritual guides will be the psalmist, the writers of other books of Sacred Scripture, various saints, theologians, authors, and recent popes.

Take out a little time to enter into the season with hope in your heart, awaiting this coming feast as the people of Israel did ... as Simeon and Anna did ... as John the Baptist did ... as Joseph and Mary did.

You will find as they did, that God comes in a special way to the people who steadfastly hope for His coming.


