Pastor's Message

We continue the celebration of Christmas with a focus on the family. One of the enduring wonders of Christmas is that God chose to be born into a human family. He put his seal upon family life. We are reminded this Sunday that every family is special. Every family is holy in its own way.

St John Chrysostom (died in 407 A.D.) wrote this: "The Christian home is the Church in miniature. If all places of worship should be destroyed, or their use forbidden, the family would still remain the place where God would be remembered and worshipped".

Christmas places God's stamp on family life. It is the locus of nurture and life, acceptance and values. It is there that we are loved and learn to love. It is there too that we learn that all life is relational. We learn to trust and to relate to one another in mutual trust.

As the recent Church Synod on the Family pointed out, family life today is under severe stress in a world of changing cultures and the eclipse of Gospel values. The family is crucial to the life of the Church and the spread of the Gospel.

We must be careful too not to romanticize the family or think of some idealized version of family life. Each family is unique and each family faces its own challenges. Sometimes we place expectations on the family that are too high—more freight than the traffic can bear.

The Scripture readings for this Feast of the Holy Family reflect timeless values and insights that can support family life even today.

In the first reading (1 Samuel 20:22, 24-28) Samuel's parents are faithful to their religious obligations and offer the required sacrifice on the birth of their son. Hannah gives thanks for the gift of her child and dedicates him to God.

The second reading (1 John 3:1-2, 21-24) reminds us that there is another family to which we belong, namely the family of faith. Through faith and baptism we are indeed children of God. "We are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed".

The Gospel reading from Luke recalls a very human incident in the life of Christ. At the age of twelve on a visit to the temple he is separated from his family by an accident. The fear expressed by Mary and Joseph captures the fear of every parent. "Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety". Misunderstandings happen in every family. May your family be blessed this Christmas time.

Jubilee Year of Mercy: Our Parish is planning a special event during Lent that will center on small groups meeting once a week for six weeks to reflect on the role of mercy and forgiveness in our lives. This will take the place of the Parish Mission this year. More information in the coming weeks. See also information on small groups in this copy of the bulletin.

FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF NAZARETH

...Today our gaze on the Holy Family lets us also be drawn into the simplicity of the life they led in Nazareth. It is an example that does our families great good, helping them increasingly to become communities of love and reconciliation, in which tenderness, mutual help, and mutual forgiveness is experienced. Let us remember the three key words for living in peace and joy in the family: "may I", "thank you" and "sorry". In our family, when we are not intrusive and ask "may I", in our family when we are not selfish and learn to say "thank you", and when in a family one realizes he has done something wrong and knows how to say "sorry", in that family there is peace and joy. Let us remember these three words. Can we repeat them all together: may I, thank you, sorry. (Everyone: may I, thank you, sorry!) I would also like to encourage families to become aware of the importance they have in the Church and in society. The proclamation of the Gospel, in fact, first passes through the family to reach the various spheres of daily life.

Let us fervently call upon Mary Most Holy, the Mother of Jesus and our Mother, and St Joseph her spouse. Let us ask them to enlighten, comfort and guide every family in the world, so that they may fulfil with dignity and peace the mission which God has entrusted to them.
