## Today's Readings

## Pastor's Message

**"So Faith, Hope, and Love remain; but the greatest is Love". (I Corinthians 13:13)**

Our Scripture readings today include Paul's celebration of love. He speaks of a special kind of love that is called "Agape" in Greek, the love that is a reflection of God's love for us.

In our modern usage the word love is ambiguous and sometimes almost trivial. We love our i-phone and our cats and our favorite T.V. show and the sunrise on the lake. And yes, we love people and we love our friends. Surely the word needs some refinement or re-definition if we are to speak with clarity.

Paul's address to the Corinthians is quite specific. He has in mind the kind of love that is people-centered and that is self-giving and sacrificial. The kind of love that goes the extra mile for someone.

His language is beautiful and lyrical, more poetry than prose. He lifts his readers to the heights of idealism and takes their imagination to that perfect place where love endures to conquer all with its grace and magnanimity. We are humbled to hear that "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things".

A young doctor's story elaborates on Paul's idealism. Dr. Fosarelli was raised in a Catholic family. He attended Catholic schools from grade school through college. In medical school at Johns Hopkins he began to have doubts about his faith. He raised questions and became an agnostic. "Give me the proof" I said, "to those who would listen and I will believe".

After a few years in medical practice working with H.I.V. infected infants, children and teens and listening to their questions, he rediscovered faith in God. He wrote: "Consider selfless service to others. What explanation for it suffices? From an evolutionary prospective it makes no sense. Why risk one's life to save a person who is not kin? Yet, firefighters and emergency care workers do it all the time. Doing such jobs well means risking one's life. Where does the desire for such self-giving come from; since it is of no practical benefit to themselves?"

To put it in theological language: what is the origin of agape love? There is but one answer—it comes from God. Those who give selfless service to others show forth the God who gives and sustains. They reflect something of the divine in the midst of their own flawed humanity". How right is this young doctor!

### **Making Christ's Love Visible**

St. Paul, in the Letter to the Ephesians, emphasizes the great mystery is reflected in Christian spouses: the relationship established by Christ with the Church, a nuptial relationship (cf. 5:21-33). The Church is the bride of Christ. This is their relationship. This means that matrimony responds to a specific vocation and must be considered as a consecration (cf. Gaudium et Spes, 48; Familiaris Consortio, 56). It is a consecration; the man and woman are consecrated in their love. The spouses, in fact, by virtue of the sacrament, are invested with a true

and proper mission to that starting with the simple ordinary things of life, they may make visible the love with which Christ loves His Church, by continuing to give His life in fidelity and service.

## Lenten Regulations

The annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. Catechumens are led to the Sacraments of Initiation by means of the Rite of Election, the scrutinies, and Catechesis. The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises.

The Catholic Church, in an attempt to help Catholics do at least a minimum during Lent, asks all Catholics to fast and abstain from meat on certain days. **Fasting means** to limit food to one full meal a day with the possibility of two smaller meals (not adding up to a full meal) as needed. **Abstinence means** not eating meat, although fish is allowed. Catholics are asked to observe all days of fasting and abstinence which is one of the precepts of the Church.

**Catholics 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

**Catholics between the ages of 14 and 59 are also to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If one's work or health make it inadvisable to fast or abstain from meat, they are not obligated to do so.**

## Stations Of The Cross

According to the Method of St. Francis of Assisi



For Roman Catholics throughout the world, the Stations of the Cross are synonymous with Lent, Holy Week and, especially, Good Friday. This devotion is also known as the "Way of the Cross", the "Via Crucis", and the "Via Dolorosa." It commemorates 14 key events on the day of Christ's crucifixion. The majority of these key events concern His final walk through the streets of Jerusalem, carrying the Cross.

The Stations originated in medieval Europe when wars prevented Christian pilgrims from visiting the Holy Land. European artists created works depicting scenes of Christ's journey to Calvary. The faithful installed these sculptures or paintings at intervals along a procession route, inside the parish church or outdoors. Performing the devotion meant walking the entire route, stopping to pray at each "station."

Today, images of the Stations (or simple crosses representing them) are on display in almost all Catholic churches. They serve mainly as a focus for Lenten worship services. But the Stations can also be prayed privately, at any time of the year, even at home.
