Today's Readings



First Reading — The LORD is a God of justice who hears the cry of the oppressed, the orphan, the widow, the lowly. (Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18)

Psalm — The Lord hears the cry of the poor. (Psalm 34)

Second Reading — The crown of righteousness awaits me. (2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18)

Gospel — The tax collector stood at a distance, beat his breast, and prayed, “O God, be merciful to me, a sinner”. (Luke 18:9-14)

Pastor's Message

The topic of prayer is central again this Sunday to opening up the assigned Scriptures. In a way we should not be surprised. Prayer is the language of faith. Because we believe, we also pray. As the poet said: "More things are wrought by the power of prayer than this world dreams of".

The Gospel Reading (Luke 18:9-14) is by way of a parable, a story taken from daily life and having a lesson hidden within it. We are meant to be in the parable too. With whom do we identify in today's parable?

In our better moments we would like to think the tax collector represents us. We like his humility and his contrite spirit. In truth we probably also have something of the Pharisee in us. Aren't we proud of our success and our achievements and don't we expect God to give us a favorable hearing. After all, we are so much better than other people we know.

Jesus is reminding us of two possible attitudes when we pray. One is self-righteousness—the attitude of the Pharisee. There is a swagger about him that is off-putting. The other attitude is humility as reflected by the tax collector.

While the Pharisee follows the prescriptions of the Law that tell him how to act outwardly, the tax collector has had an interior conversion that led him to recognize his sinfulness. He does not understand his need for God. The tax collector acknowledges his sin and knows his need for wholeness and forgiveness that only comes from God.

We should not overlook the magnificent testimony of Paul in the Second Reading today (2 Tim. 4:6-8). It is not only a great Scripture, it is also lofty literature: "I am already being poured out like a libation, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith". May that be said of each of us and all of us!

Quote of Note: "We have long taught that the one God, maker of Heaven and Earth, calls each and every individual into being, loves every individual and commands believers to love and show mercy to every individual....We respect those who disagree with what we teach. Can they respect us?" (Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore)

A Prayer for This Week: "I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall be ever in my mouth." (Ps. 34)




