

Today's Readings



First Reading — He shall bring justice for the afflicted; the earth shall overflow with the knowledge of the LORD. (Isaiah 11:1-10)

Psalm — Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever. (Psalm 72)

Second Reading — Glorify God by living in harmony with one another, welcoming each other as Christ welcomed you. (Romans 15:4-9)

Gospel — Produce good fruit worthy of your baptism; repent, for the reign of God is near. (Matthew 3:1-12)

Pastor's Message

In the Second Sunday of Advent we are thrilled again by the beautiful poetry of Isaiah, the same poetry that inspired Handel's Messiah.

"The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom and understanding, a spirit of counsel and of strength, a spirit of knowledge and fear of the Lord". The Messiah will be clothed with these gifts of the Holy Spirit. Later in the Reading (Is. 11:1-10), the prophet writes: "Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them....There shall be no harm on all my Holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord".

But, we ask, was Isaiah a hopeless dreamer? Naïve? Was he a visionary who dreamed too much? He wrote at a time of war and terror when the world was in upheaval. Yet, he saw a different future. A paradisal future when ancient enmities would be dissolved.

In Jesus, the Messiah, Isaiah's hopes were fulfilled. Peace and harmony were inaugurated. The power of sin and death were vanquished. The full vision of Isaiah has not yet been realized. It remains a hope, as yet unfulfilled. But the vision and the hope must not be lost. That's why we need Advent to give us a fresh supply of hope. Without that hope we become cynical or fearful. We resort to slogans and wistful nostalgia.

The vision of Isaiah emboldens the hope of Advent. It breaks out in unexpected places and events if we have but eyes to see. We live in the interim between the "now and the not yet". We learn to live with ambiguity and ambivalence.

Three years ago this month Pope Francis published a major document called The "Joy of the Gospel". In it the Pope expressed his hope that the Church would go forth into the world, getting the mud of the streets on its shoes, to deliver the message of God's care for every bit of it. "We love this magnificent planet on which God has put us", he wrote. And again, this striking sentence: "Rather than experts in dire predictions, dour judges bent on rooting out every threat and deviation, we should appear as joyful messengers of challenging proposals, guardians of love and beauty which shine forth in a life of fidelity to the Gospel".


