Today's Readings



First Reading — The barren deserts will rejoice and flower. Tired bodies will receive strength. Aching hearts will be made glad. (*Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10*)

Psalm — Lord, come and save us. (*Psalm 146*)

Second Reading — Be patient, for the coming of the Lord is as sure as the rain. (*James 5:7-10*)

Gospel — Tell of what you hear and see: The blind regain their vision, the crippled their movement, the deaf their hearing. (*Matthew 11:2-11*)

Pastor's Message

The disciples of John the Baptist in today's Gospel selection (Mt. 11:2-11) are sent to Jesus to ask him: "Are you he who is to come or should we look for another?". It is the great question for all of us who believe.

John the Baptist was in prison in this scene. He was put there at the instigation of King Herod. He is in the darkness of the dungeon but also in the darkness of doubt. Did I make a mistake? Is this where it ends? Why did I believe? The dark night of doubt has fallen on John the Baptist.

Fashioned by God in the desert, John had his own expectations of God. He thought the Messiah would be different. He expected strong judgement. A little fire and brimstone might have helped. A stronger use of power maybe.

Surely, Jesus would work his power to release John from prison. If he is the Messiah! Or is he really the Messiah?

The answer received by John's disciples from Jesus is intriguing. "The blind see, the lame walk, the deaf hear, lepers are cleansed and the dead are raised to life. The poor have the Good News preached to them.

Jesus is not just the projection of our inner hopes and expectations. He is not just the fulfillment of our Christmas shopping list. He is not always the kind of Messiah we would like him to be. We have to be attentive to his coming.

There is a story of Rabbi Joshua Ben Levi who talked to the prophet Elijah as good Rabbis once were wont to do. "Where" Rabbi Joshua asked, "Shall I find the Messiah?". "At the gate of the city", Elijah replied. "How shall I recognize him?", Rabbi Joshua asked. Elijah replied: "He sits among the lepers". "Among the Lepers", cried Rabbi Joshua, "What is he doing there?". "He changes their bandages", Elijah replied. "He changes them one by one".

And so it is that the blind see, and the lame still walk and the hungry are fed and people are given back the gift of life by caring people and loving people, even in the midst of suffering. These are the pockets of hope that provide the surest answer to the original question: Where is God?
