Today's Readings

Pastor's Message

One of the great values enshrined in the Judeo-Christian tradition is hospitality, the art of welcoming the guest or the stranger. Great blessings are seen to flow from this basic act of kindness and decency.

The prophet Elisha (in the First Reading) received hospitality from an unknown couple when he stopped in the town of Shunem in his travels. He had a standing invitation to stay with the couple whenever he passed that way. They even dedicated a special room for him on the roof of their home.

The couple had been childless—a great sadness to endure in that ancient culture. As a reward for their hospitality, Elisha promised them that God would give them a son within the year.

The gift of hospitality in the Bible brings blessings. Guests bear precious gifts, life-affirming gifts. Abraham and Sara entertained three strangers in the book of Genesis and discovered that God visited them as they welcomed the strangers. Sara was rewarded with the promise of a son.

The widow of Zarephath in the book of Kings offered food and shelter to the prophet Elijah in a time of famine. She was rewarded with an abundance of food and oil during the famine and her dead son was restored to life.

The two disciples on the road to Emmaus invited the stranger who had walked along with them to stay with them in their home for the night. In the course of the meal he revealed himself to them as the Eucharistic Lord, risen from the dead.

In the Gospel selection today (Mt. 10:37-42) not even the cup of cold water offered to the stranger in the heat of the day will go unrewarded.

St. Benedict reminded his monks to welcome the guest to the monastery as they would welcome Christ. Benedictine monasteries to this day are famous for their hospitality.

In the Eucharist we experience the very hospitality of God. He comes invisible, under the signs of bread and wine and in receiving him we are nourished beyond imagining.

A Note from Fr. Sexton:




