Today's Readings



First Reading — My word will achieve the end for which it was sent. (Isaiah 55:10-11)

Psalm — The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest. (Psalm 65)

Second Reading — We, who have the first-fruits of the Spirit, groan within ourselves awaiting the redemption of our bodies. (Romans 8:18-23)

Gospel — Some seed fell on rich soil and produced fruit. (Matthew 13:1-23 [1-9])

Pastor's Message

The images in today's Scriptures are from an agrarian society. It was a simple, pre-scientific time when people lived close to the land and found parables and lessons in abundance.

Farmers don't sow the seed by hand any longer. It is done by high powered machines. But farmers still recognize that you can't guarantee the harvest. God and the weather factor in.

On the other hand, the fertility of the earth is astonishing. Gardeners as well as farmers know that. The life that comes from the seed and the soil sustains us all and begins with the Creator, the source and giver of all life.

The prophet, Isaiah, speaks in praise of rain and snow that water the earth, making it fertile and fruitful. Jesus likewise, speaks in admiration of the farmer who plants the seed in the springtime and waits for the harvest. He knows that, even though there will be losses, the eventual harvest will be amazing.

The seed spoken of in today's Scriptures is a metaphor for the Word of God, written in the Scriptures and in our hearts. It has the power to change us and to change the world.

In St. Paul's Cathedral in London there is buried an Anglican priest, Samuel Barnett, who worked faithfully for many years in the slums of east London. The results were small and disappointing; at least the visible results.

On his memorial stone is carved a figure of the sower in Jesus' parable, walking down the field and scattering seed freely. Underneath the carving are these words: "Fear not to sow on account of the birds".

St. Justin, Martyr, in the second century said the parable of the sower was meant as encouragement to Christians in their labors. In spite of all the frustrations and failures, God's rule advances and the harvest exceeds all expectations.

The Dutch painter, Vincent Van Gogh (1853-90), in the last year of his life painted a famous painting which he titled "The Sower", based on today's Gospel. He used a local peasant farmer as his model. The painting conveys power and light and joy. As the farmer scatters the seed there is a glorious sunrise in the background emitting golden light.

He said he wanted to convey the idea that there is meaning in the mundane details of daily life—watering a plant, sowing seed in spring, feeding an animal. There is a quiet dignity in human work, always more than meets the eye. The ripples of our good deeds will go on and on. The harvest, though long in coming, will surely surprise us.


A Note from Fr. Sexton:

The Synod of Bishops will convene in Rome in October, 2018 to discuss the topic: "Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment". This will be the first Synod of Bishops to focus on youth.
