

Pastor's Message

Who Has the Keys?

The symbolism of keys is highly significant in today's Reading from the Old Testament (Is. 22:19-23) and in the Gospel (Mt. 16:13-20). Keys can indicate status or security or freedom (think of car keys). Like so much else in our changing world, keys may be soon obsolete. Instead, we may simple have to swipe a plastic card, or punch in a code or type in a P.I.N. Still, the symbolism of access and authority and a certain power will endure. There used to be a devotional prayer book in my distant past called *A Key to Heaven*. That key will hardly become obsolete.

In the First Reading today we are told that Shebna held a position of influence, like that of a chief-of-staff in the reign of King Hezekiah. He is being removed from office for an abuse of power. He is told that he will be "Thrust from his office" and "Pulled down from his position".

Shebna will be replaced by a new chief-of-staff, named Eliakim. "I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim's shoulder; when he opens, no one shall shut; when he shuts, no one will open". That sounds like real power.

But why is Shebna being replaced? We are not told in the present text. In an earlier verse (19:16) we are given a clue. Shebna had ordered an ostentatious and elaborate tomb carved out of rock on a high place for his future monument. The action was vain and arrogant and a misuse of power and money. The king was not happy and dismissed him. A cautionary tale here. Kings or presidents do not like to be upstaged. Where have we heard that one recently?

In the Gospel from Matthew, Simon confesses that Jesus is the Messiah and Son of God. In return for such faith, Jesus gives him a new name. He will be called Peter, which means, "Rock" and on the rock of that faith and the faith of the other Apostles, Jesus promises to "build his church" and gives Peter the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

Pope John Paul II in his book, *Crossing the Threshold of Hope*, wrote:

"Lofty titles are of little importance. What is important originates in the death and resurrection of Christ. What is important is that which comes from the power of the Holy Spirit. For example, Peter, together with the other Apostles and Paul, became authentic witnesses of Christ, faithful until the shedding of their own blood" - - - In the Church built on the rock that is Christ, Peter, the Apostles and their successors are witnesses of God, crucified and risen in Christ. They are witnesses of the life that is stronger than death".

Boston butts will be sold for \$35; \$25 for pork ribs; \$10 for a whole chicken.


All meat will be freshly smoked with KOC "special dry rub".




