Father Bill's Weekly Message

"INFINITE DIGNITY"

On April 8, 2024, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a Declaration entitled, "Dignitas Infinita", in English, "Infinite Dignity". This declaration is the fruit of **five years** of consultation with the world's bishops, including the Bishop of Rome.

The Prefect of the Dicastery, Victor Manuel Cardinal Fernandez, writes, "This Declaration does not set out to exhaust such a rich and crucial subject. Instead, its aim is to offer some points of reflection that can help us maintain an awareness of human dignity amid the complex historical moment in which we are living. This is so that we may not lose our way and open ourselves to more wounds and profound sufferings amid the numerous concerns and anxieties of our time."

The Introduction notes that we have recently observed the 75th anniversary of the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights* issued by the United Nations General Assembly. (Paragraph 2) This declaration was based on the belief that, "Every human person possesses an infinite dignity, inalienably grounded in his or her very being, which prevails in and beyond every circumstance, state, or situation the person may ever encounter." (#1)

The declaration emphasizes ontological dignity, which it defines as belonging to the person, "as such simply because he or she exists and is willed, created, and loved by God." (#7) From that belief, a person may speak of moral dignity, "how people exercise their freedom." (#7); social dignity, "the quality of a person's living conditions"; and existential dignity, "the type of dignity implied in the discussion of a "dignified" life". (#8) The ontological dignity of the person must always be considered when speaking of the other types of dignity.

No matter what capacities the person may possess or lack, they still maintain their ontological dignity as created and willed by God.


