Father Bill's Weekly Message

ORDINARY TIME

We are beginning a long stretch of Sundays called *Ordinary Time* in the Liturgical Year. It will last from today until December 1st, the First Sunday of Advent.

To call this time "Ordinary" does not mean it is unimportant or common. The word "Ordinary" comes from the word "Ordinal". It means to hit a target or reach a goal. The missiles, bombs, and bullets launched by a military force are called "Ordinance." In this case, the goal or target is the kingdom of God.

During Ordinary Time we follow the ministry of Jesus laid out in the Gospels. We contemplate the words and actions of Jesus and try to be more faithful disciples. Then we can become witnesses to Jesus Christ as Lord.

During most of this stretch of Ordinary Time we are following the Gospel of Mark. Mark's Gospel uses a lot of military terminology. Even the word "gospel" means good news of a victory on the battlefield brought back to the king.

This "victory" is won by Jesus' death on the cross. In Chapter 10 of Mark's Gospel, Jesus says that He came, "to give his life as a ransom for many." That phrase in Greek describes a soldier who dies in battle. Jesus is Lord and Savior because He lays down His life for all people.

If we wish to be Jesus' disciples, we will have to follow His example as well as His words. We will have to lay down our lives in imitation of Him. Victory comes through surrender to God's will. The Gospels show us how. Jesus Christ, the risen Lord, gives us the grace to do it.

Surfsiders




