## Mission Cooperative Appeal

This weekend, we will have the opportunity to participate in the Church's missionary activity through the annual Missionary Cooperative Appeal. This annual collection is divided among a number of specific dioceses each year.

This year there are six dioceses receiving proceeds from this collection: The Diocese of Aguascalientes, Mexico; The Diocese of Irinjalakuda, India; The Diocese of Kumba, Cameroon; The Diocese of Maiduguri, Nigeria; The Diocese of Matagalpa, Nicaragua; and The Diocese of Warangal, India. Most of these dioceses are chosen because priests from those dioceses are serving in our diocese.

The Catholic Church is missionary in nature. We are dedicated to furthering the mission of Jesus Christ to draw all people to Himself. Jesus Christ founded only one Church. It is to be His instrument to continue His mission. The Church is *Catholic*, that is, universal.

These dioceses lack the funding to build churches and schools, to purchase religious educational materials, to support clergy and religious, and to carry on other church activities that build up the faith of their members. This collection helps these dioceses continue their share in the mission of the Church.

In <u>The Joy of the Gospel</u>, Pope Francis wrote, "Each Christian and every community must discern the path that the Lord points out, but all of us are asked to obey his call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach the "peripheries" in need of the light of the Gospel." (#20)




