Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

There is currently no agreement among Christians about how to number the Ten Commandments. The list can be found in Exodus 20, 1-17 and Deuteronomy 5, 6-21. The two versions do not match exactly. There are different explanations given of the rationale for the commandments.

There is also a difference between the "Protestant" and "Catholic" versions of numbering the commandments. Protestants claim Exodus 20, 4-6 as the Second Commandment, while Catholics claim those verses are part of the First Commandment. That means Exodus 20, 7 would be considered the Third Commandment by most Protestants, but the Second Commandment by Catholics.

What Protestants would consider Commandments 3-9; Catholics would consider Commandments 2-8. Then Exodus 20, 17 is considered the Tenth Commandment by Protestants, while Catholics divide v. 17 into two commandments, considering not coveting beings different from not coveting things.

After the people broke the Second/First Commandment, Moses broke the tablets that had been inscribed by God as a prophetic symbol of the breaking of the covenant between God and Israel. (Exodus 32) Then in Exodus 34 the tablets are reinscribed, either by God (v.1) or by Moses (vv. 27 -28). For the first time they are called, "the ten commandments." (Exodus 34, 28) Here there are some additions (vv. 10-26) that do not appear in the Ten Commandments delineated in Exodus or Deuteronomy.

All told, there are 311 precepts in the Old Testament Law contained in Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. Jesus divides them into two commandments, love of God and love of neighbor. (Mark 12-28-34) If we were steadfast in our love of God and love of neighbor, we would probably follow all the commandments. Jesus offers a path rather than a warning.


