Father Bill's Weekly Message

OUIET

July is a quiet month in the parish.

Programs have yet to start up, since they usually follow the school year. People who have children or grandchildren of school age use the opportunity of school breaks to go on vacation.

In most parishes, Mass attendance drops.

There is nothing wrong with quiet. We live in a busy society where people believe they must always be active and productive. I remember after my father retired, he always had the television on in his den, even if he was in another room. I asked him why and he responded, "I like the noise." A lack of noise can be disconcerting for many people.

I went on a retreat once where the retreat master spoke about the meaning of the word "retreat". He described it as a pulling back to reorganize, rest, and resupply. That retreat wasn't long enough to do those things, but the idea was important. We all need time to refresh ourselves. That won't happen if we are constantly busy.

Productivity is a buzzword in business. Business leaders don't seem to understand that if we want to maintain productivity, we need to be constantly refreshing ourselves. Otherwise, we will burn out and they will have to search for another "productive" employee.

Perhaps the solution is more quiet and less noise in our lives. God never requires more of us than we are able to give. In the Gospels, Jesus is described as going to a deserted place to spend time in prayer. There was no one else around and no noise. Jesus is divine, but He is also human. He needed solitude to refresh Himself. Let that be a lesson for us.


