Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE STATUE OF MARY IN THE COLUMBARIUM

Recently, I have received complaints about moving the statue of the Blessed Mother to the Columbarium Garden. This is an opportunity to catechize about what the Catholic Church teaches about death and resurrection.

One of the complaints was stated as, "Why did you move the statue of Mary to a place with dead people?" Catholics believe when we die, the soul is separated from the body. At the resurrection at the end of time, people's souls will be reunited with their "glorified body." (1Corinthians 15, 42-44; Revelation 20, 4-6, 11-15) Their remains are to be treated with the respect due a human body created by God.

In the Hail Mary, we say, "Holy Mary. Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death." Mary is the Mother of all the living, even those who are living in Heaven or Purgatory. Catholics believe in the "resurrection of the body and life everlasting." (Apostles Creed) The Columbarium Garden is the perfect place for a statue of the Blessed Mother.

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church we read, "at the present time some of his (Christ's) disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory. All, indeed, who are of Christ and who have his Spirit, form one Church and in Christ cleave together." (#954)

As Catholics, we should experience union with "those who have gone before us." The Columbarium Garden was built as a place of prayer, to express our union with the Departed Faithful, rather than falsely believe we are separated from them. The remains in the Columbarium are **not** "a bunch of dead people". They are the remains of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Update from Deacon Lee and Cheryl

Cheryl and I are so encouraged by all the prayers and offers to help in any way.

This has been a journey that no one would ever ask for... However it is faith enriching to see God working through so many people.

It has been a month long process of determining the illness and then determining the treatment. What lies ahead is a long journey toward what we hope to be a cure.

Mid-month I was diagnosed with CMML, a chronic type of Leukemia with the only possibility for a cure being a bone marrow transplant. Our journey started at St Vincent's but is transitioning to MD Anderson as Cheryl and I will be living in Houston for the next 30 to 40 days to undergo Clinical Trials as a treatment for CMML. Afterwards moving back to Birmingham.

In the coming months as a match is found and the treatments are effective in reducing the severity of the disease, we will then seek a bone marrow transplant at UAB with hopes for remission.

Considering this is a long process we have decided it best to down-

size and return to Birmingham closer to family and UAB. The move should happen the first week of September with most of the time prior being spent in Houston.

This leaves only a couple weekends to personally thank so many. For so many who have offered prayers and support who themselves are going through great trials as well. Reflecting true Christianity and allowing a glimpse of the Kingdom of God in the midst of this illness. It is the love and prayers from you all, that give us the strength to place our faith in God and take it one day at a time.

We don't know or need to know what tomorrow brings. It is faith enriching when tomorrow gets here to look back and see God's hand guiding each step of the way.

There have already been countless stories of God putting the right person, place or situation guiding us to the next step.

God is GOOD and it is so evident in each of you! May you all be

blessed in a special way.


