THE LEGION OF MARY

The Legion of Mary is an Association of Catholics who, under the sanction of the Church and under the powerful leadership of Mary Immaculate, have formed themselves for service in the struggle which is perpetually waged by the Church against the world's evil powers.

It was begun by Servant of God Frank Duff in 1921 in the Dublin Archdiocese. His profound insights into the role of the Holy Spirit and the Blessed Virgin Mary in the plan of Redemption, and the role of the lay faithful in the mission of the Church, is reflected in the legion handbook, which is almost entirely his composition.

The object of the Legion of Mary is the glory of God through the holiness of its members developed by prayer and active cooperation, under ecclesiastical guidance, in Mary's and Church's work in advancing the reign of Christ. This includes prayer and works of mercy.

The spirit of the Legion is that of Mary herself. It aspires after her profound humility, her perfect obedience, her continual prayer, and above all her faith, that virtue which has in her alone been found to its utmost extent.

The Legion is built in the first place upon a profound faith in God and in the love he bears his children. We wish to be saints. God yearns for it a million times more than us.

There is a group of parishioners devoted to the principals of the Legion. There is a group that meets weekly and a larger group, called "Praying Members", who dedicate themselves to praying the Legion's prayers, but are unable to attend the meetings.

On Sunday, November 17th the Legion of Mary will have a gathering in the parish hall following the 11:15 Mass. The purpose is to introduce those interested in joining the Legion to the prayer and work of this group. Everyone is invited to attend.


