Father Bill's Weekly Message

SIGNS OF HOPE

The Jubilee Year will begin on December 24, 2024, and lasts until December 28, 2025. It is an opportunity for renewal of our faith in Jesus Christ. Pope Francis lists "signs of hope." These are signs of the times that the Lord gives us.

There is the desire for peace in our world. The Pope writes, "Heedless of the past, humanity is confronting yet another ordeal, as many peoples are prey to brutality and violence." Perhaps the weariness of war is a sign that will lead to a negotiated, lasting peace.

There is an enthusiasm for life and a readiness to share it. The Pope decries a decline in the birthrate in some countries. He writes, "Openness to life and responsible parenthood is the design that the Creator has implanted in the hearts and bodies of men and women, a mission that the Lord has entrusted to spouses and to their love."

The Pope writes, "we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships." He calls for Jubilee forgiveness as outlined in the scriptures. (Luke 4, 18-19)

The Pope calls for visiting the sick, at home or in the hospital. "Their sufferings can be allayed by the closeness and affection of those who visit them." He also calls for an expression of gratitude for healthcare workers.

The Pope calls for a special outreach to the young. He writes, "The Jubilee should inspire the Church to make greater efforts to reach out to them."

The Pope writes about migrants, the elderly, and the poor. "May the Christian community always be prepared to defend the rights of those who are most vulnerable, opening wide its doors to welcome them, lest anyone be robbed of the hope of a better future."


