Father Bill's Weekly Message

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

January 26th through February 1st is Catholic Schools Week in the Diocese of Birmingham. As someone who attended Catholic schools at St. Francis Xavier and John Carroll Catholic in Birmingham, I am grateful for the opportunity to have had a Catholic Education. It prepared me for life as a practicing Catholic.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "Education is integral to the mission of the Church to proclaim the good news. First and foremost, every Catholic institution is a place to encounter the living God, who in Jesus Christ, reveals His transforming love and truth." This is true of authentic Catholic education.

The School System of the Diocese of Birmingham consists of 14 elementary schools, 3 high schools, and 2 early learning centers. Other parishes are in the process of beginning Catholic schools. The recently enacted Choose Act in the State of Alabama will provide \$7,000.00 from the state to assist parents in choosing a private education for their children.

As a child and young person, I did not have a choice about attending Catholic schools. My six siblings and I were going to a Catholic school! As I look back, I'm glad I did. It instilled in me the importance of faith in my daily life. I have always been interested in practicing my Catholic faith, even before I went to the seminary. Catholic education implanted in me a desire for learning that is always alive. Even if I didn't always know specifics about the Catholic faith, I knew it was important.

The parochial school system existed in the United States before the public school system. Education was always seen as a key to success in life in our country. We recognize the important place Catholic Schools have played in the life of the Church.


