Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

This Sunday we conclude the liturgical season of Christmas with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. As with all the other observances of Christmas, this event reveals something about Jesus's humanity and His divinity.

Humanity: The baptism of John was, "of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." (Luke 3, 3) It was an opportunity to prepare for the coming of the Messiah. The person first had to repent, then confess their sins, and then the baptism was the final stage to show the person was a true Israelite.

Jesus did not need to repent or be forgiven. He underwent John's baptism to show His identification with sinful humanity. He came to call us to repentance. He took on all the limitations of being human. He was like us in all things, but sin. (Hebrews 4, 15) His baptism by John shows His full humanity.

Divinity: According to the Gospel of Luke, after He was baptized and was praying, the sky opened, the Holy Spirit descended in the form of a dove, and a voice came from heaven saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

The voice was the Father identifying Jesus as His only begotten Son. Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of the eternal Father. Though He is 100% human, He is also 100% God. The voice identifies Jesus as "my" beloved Son. Jesus Christ is not one among many. He is unique. He alone is the savior.

As Catholics, we have had since December 25th to contemplate the full humanity and the full divinity of Jesus Christ. By the grace of God, we may have scratched the surface of this mystery. We can always go back to it. The scriptures of the Christmas season are a good guide.




